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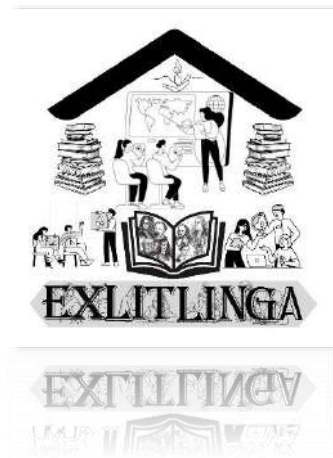

Conclusion

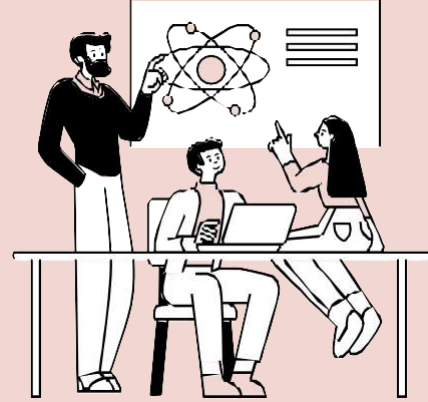

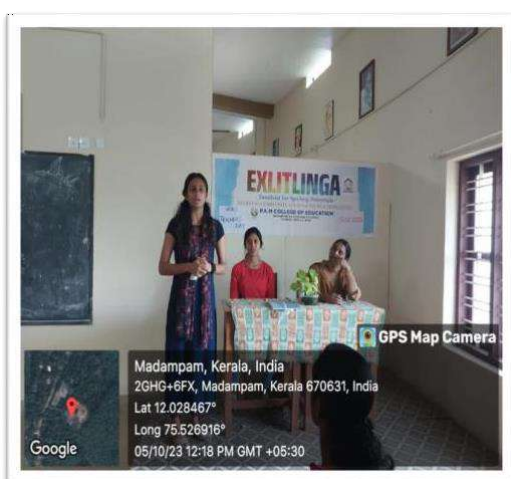
Tactile Release Success

The learning community for English Teachers 2023-25, 'Exlitlinga' decided to execute a seminar series on 'English Language Education: A General Introduction.

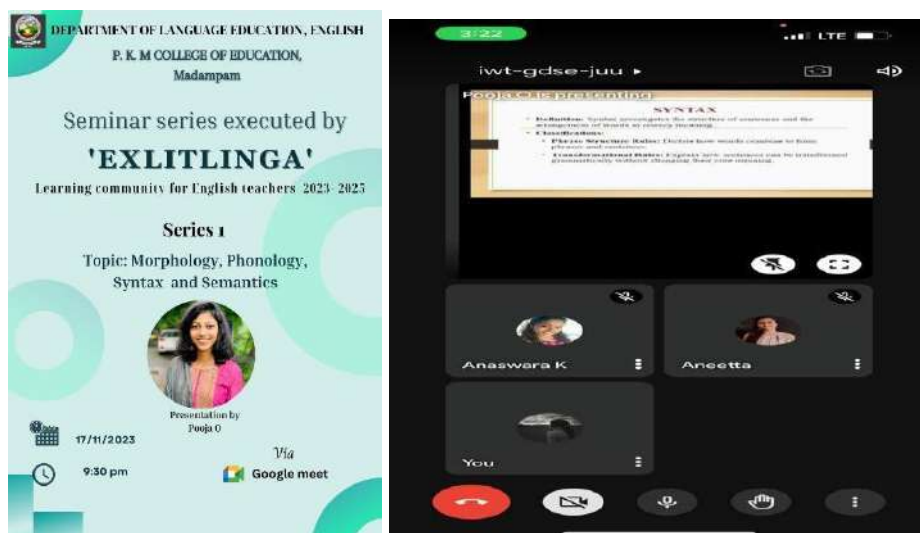

She discussed the topic well, presenting an informative PowerPoint presentation.

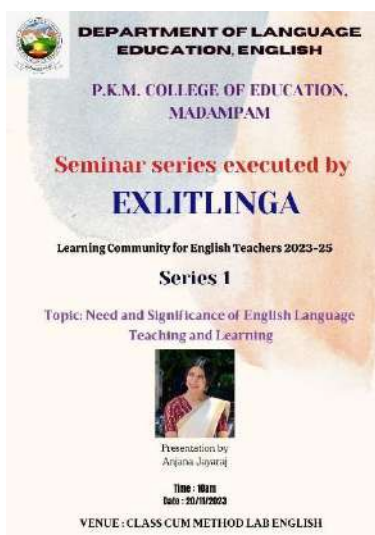

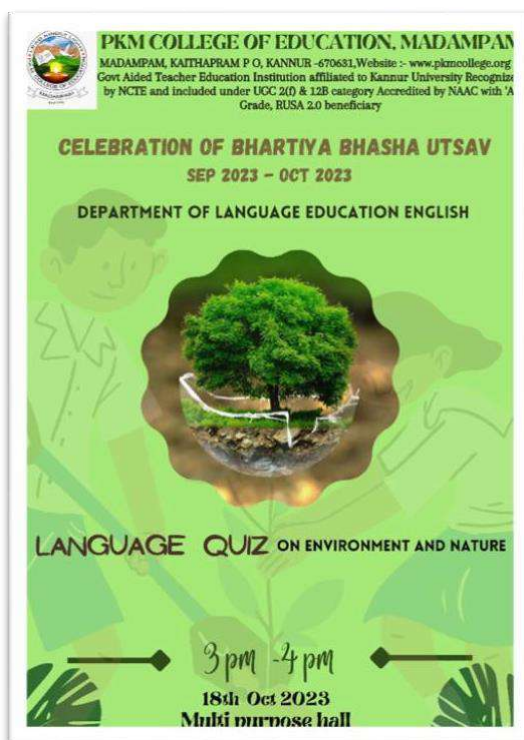
Language Quiz Program Report

Handwriting Day Observance Report - January 23, 2024



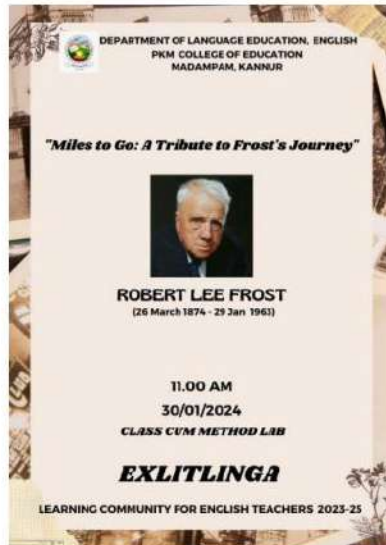

and “VerseVisions: Poetic Profiles,” were officially released, symbolizing the collective literary prowess of the Exlitlinga members

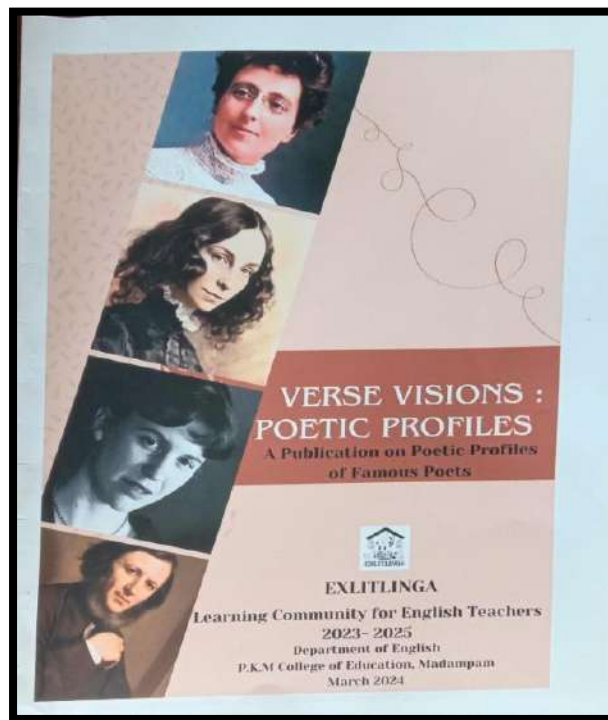

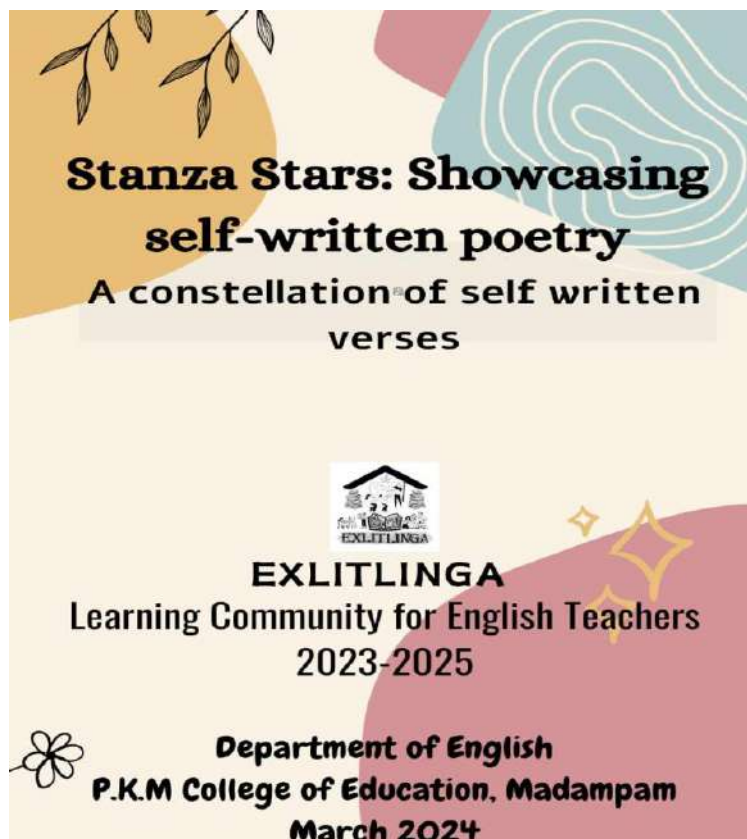
